The First Step



Do you have diabetes? Do you have burning pain in your feet? If your answer is yes to both of these questions, you may qualify for a study aimed at providing improved treatment of the pain. The treatment involves putting a gel (cream) on your feet that contains a medicine called clonidine.

Study Medications

Individuals who take part in this study will continue to take their regular medications as usual, in addition to the study drug. Individuals who are interested in taking part in this study, and who participate, will be given either clonidine 0.1% topical gel applied three times a day on the skin or placebo (a substance which does not contain the active drug). All study materials will be provided at no cost to the participant.

Study Plan

The plan is for up to 250 individuals (male or female) to receive clonidine 0.1% topical gel or placebo over a period of 12 weeks. You may be eligible to participate in this study if you:

- are a male or female between 18 - 80 years of age
- have Type 1 or Type 2 diabetes mellitus
- have a history of chronic pain in your feet, from complications of diabetes, for at least 6 months but no more than 5 years
- have been medically stable for at least 30 days and you are in good general health

Some restrictions may apply. The study doctor will decide if this study is suitable for you, or not.
